



THE COUNCIL OF KADOSH

Robert "Dee" Matson, 32° KCCH, Commander of Kadosh

(In continuation of this article from March & April Trestle Board on Albert Pike's Morals and Dogma.)

lthough the work is a considerable mixture of Lancient and modern mysteries and magism, there was something else which critics overlooked, and that was Pike's own simple and practical philosophy of truth, virtue, goodness, mercy, justice, and broad humanitarianism, and his belief in a beneficent, merciful, comforting and protecting God, the Father, together with his staunch adherence to constitutional republican government. In the midst of abstruse Hermetic or Alchemical formulae that threaten to lose the reader somewhere between Alpha and Omega, there will emerge a very modern lesson of public or private morals, political science the common welfare or other indispensable fundamental truth. The main trouble with Morals and Dogma is that one man was not enough to produce the work it ought to have been. The work shows no evidence of planning, of starting with simple things and proceeding to an outstanding conclusion. It seems doubtful that Pike anticipated writing so large a book at first, so that ideas which seemed appropriate for the 32nd degree are as likely to occur in the 27th or 19th, and likewise, instead of finding the Egyptian religion



disposed of in one or two degrees, or the Eleusinian Mysteries in another, the Kabbalists in a third, and Zoroastrianism in a fourth, etc., etc., each of such subjects is scattered through the whole just as Pike from time to time encountered them in the library books taken from the shelves.

But in a final word for critics: before denouncing Pike or demolishing Morals and Dogma, try, yourselves rewriting the rituals of 32 degrees, Scottish or otherwise, and then a book of some 800 or 900 pages elucidating them!

What else is there to be said?

In Memorium Donald G. Ingalls, 33°, PGM

Our Brother Donald G. Ingalls, 95, of Olympia, Washington, passed away on March 10, 2014, after a long illness. He was born July 29, 1918, to Park Ingalls and Luella "LuLu" Morris Ingalls in Humbolt, Nebraska. He lived an unassuming, but remarkable life.

Don considered Stafford, Kansas his happy childhood home, despite harsh economic conditions. He moved to Southern California with his mother in the 1930s. There he attended North Hollywood High School while working at various menial jobs to help support the family.

He served as a bomber pilot in the U.S. Army Air Corps during World War II, and afterwards was a test pilot for North American Aviation, before joining the Los Angeles Police Department.

A writer since childhood, Don wrote freelance for publications such as Desert Magazine. He was a columnist for "The Valley Times" in North Hollywood, and was editor of "The Beat" magazine for the LAPD. There he formed a friendship with fellow police officer Gene Rodenberry of later Star Trek fame, and both transitioned to the burgeoning television industry where Don spent over 35 years as a prolific film and television writer and producer.

As a young man, he became a member of North Hollywood Masonic Lodge and later the Master of that lodge. In 1978-79, he served as Grand Master of the (then) Grand Lodge of California and Hawaii. In addition, he

was Past Master of Channel Islands Lodge No. 214 by affiliation.

On April 20, 1974 Don joined the Scottish Rite in Santa Barbara and affiliated with the Valley of Ventura on October 12, 1978 as one of our charter members. He received the 33rd Degree on October 19, 1983.

During his Hollywood career, Don wrote and produced for numerous highly regarded TV series, such as "Have Gun, Will Travel," "Bonanza," "The Big Valley," "The Virginian," "Gunsmoke," "Marcus Welby, M.D.," "Star Trek," "Police Story" and "Fantasy Island." He also wrote the feature film, "Airport 1975," along with TV films, such as "Captain America" and "The Initiation of Sarah."

On retiring to Olympia, Washington in 1987, Don wrote a novel, "The Watchers on the Mountain." As a man of strong faith, he enthusiastically used his talents for the church, writing many skits, directing children in puppetry and drama, and writing a stage play for Westwood Baptist Church. He also mentored and encouraged younger writers.

He is survived by Mary, his second wife of almost 49 years, and daughter Lori Harasta, son-in-law Jim Harasta and two grandchildren, Nicole and Logan Harasta. He is also survived by first wife, Annie Smith Ingalls, daughter Diana Ingalls-Farrell, and son-in-law Thomas "Nick" Farrell. His older sisters, Parkina "Pat" Jimenez and Luella Sides, preceded him in death.
