## IN MEMORIAM Ted Whitacre

It is with deep sorrow that we report the passing of Ill:. Ted C. Whitacre.

Ted was born November 27, 1928, in Sterling, Colorado. He grew up in Nebraska, Iowa, Texas, New Mexico, and San Diego. He joined the Army Air Corps in 1946 as a flight engineer, working on the B17 bomber. He was stationed in the Philippines, Japan, Australia, and the South Pacific. He was a Korean War veteran.

Ted had an amazing impact on our Valley, participating in virtually every aspect of our organization. He originally joined the Valley of Santa Barbara in 1975, and affiliated with our Valley as a charter member. He was Chairman of Stagecraft from before 1992 until 2002, he was in charge of the Valley's programs and social events from 1997 to 2005, he served as Almoner from 1999 to 2010, and he participated in the Highway Cleanup program and the New England Summer Picnic for many years. He served as Venerable Master in 1998, and as Commander of the Council in 1993, and again in 1996 and 2005. He was created a Knight Commander of the Court of Honor in 1991 and invested with the 33<sup>rd</sup> Degree in 1997.

In addition to his work in Masonry, Ted was active in the Ventura Breakfast Lions Club, and in the First United Methodist Church of Ventura, through which he and his wife, Evelyn, served meals to the homeless for many years. His hobbies included flying model airplanes.

Ted leaves behind his wife of 32 years, Evelyn, three daughters and a son, four grand children, and nine great grandchildren. Of course Evelyn has been very involved with the activities of our Valley, and his son, Stephen, has helped with our picnics for many years.

A Scottish Rite Memorial Service was held for Ted on October  $21^{st}$  at the First United Methodist Church. Ill: Jerry Gonzales presided and Ill: Fred 'Tiny' Potter delivered the eulogy. Many members of the craft were in attendance.

Ted was much more than just this list of the many activities in which he was involved. He was a very special friend, one who was a joy to be around, one who deeply cared about those around him, and an outstanding example of a Brother Mason.

I also had the privilege and opportunity to attend the Rite Care Conference held in Denver, Colorado this past month. It was divided up into three different tracks. Track one was Speech & Language, Track two was Literacy, and Track three, which attended. was Executive Management. The first two being directed at Child Care Staff were well attended with a wealth of very qualified presenters as well as providing some continuing education credits for those attending.

Management Track which I attended was composed of persons from various foundations around the country, Scottish Rite HQ, and local kev note speakers. It was quite interesting to hear how other states operate and compare both the similarities and differences of them. Some operate each location as a whereas stand-alone operation California and some larger states operate under a state-wide foundation with individual clinics responsible for their local operations and funding. There was also much talk about Grants being a necessary process that we do not do so well. and the work that is being done to improve this process. There was also talk of a program to go after Larger National Grants if the various Orients wanted to buy into a national program. There were also many statistics published about services provided, and it was interesting to learn that the first Rite Care Program was established in Denver, Colorado. I am in the process of down loading all the presentations from the Conference and will try to provide them to anyone interested in any portion of them. Walter Bragulla has stepped down as the Almoner, a position which is an important ongoing part of our Valley and we need to willing person to fill that position.
