We are sad to announce the passing of Brother Norm on August 26

Brother Norm received his Scottish Rite degrees in 1976 and was a charter member of our Valley. He served as our Venerable Master in 1991. He was invested with his KCCH in 1989 and received the 33rd Degree in 1993. Among his many influences on our Valley he was instrumental in instituting the New England Summer Picnic.

Norm was born May 23, 1934, in Newburyport, MA. He married Eleanor L. Brown in 1957. He served in the Navy before coming to work for the County of Ventura, where he became Auditor-Controller from 1973 to 1992.

Norm was a member, Past Master and Hiram Award recipient of Poinsettia Lodge #633. He was also active with many civic organizations including Boy Scouts, Ventura County Symphony Association, United Way, Rotary Club, and Boys and Girls Clubs of Oxnard.

After retiring from the county, Norm moved to Lubbock, Texas.

Masons in Ventura County come together each year to prepare a New England Summer Picnic as a fund raiser to help children in the local community with speech and language disorders. For 25 years the Ventura County Valley of the Scottish Rite has coordinated the efforts to prepare and serve 1 ½ pound lobsters, 16 oz. steaks, mussels, corn on the cob, cole slaw, and kids' hot dogs for more than 400 people who attend every year in a secluded park in Camarillo. Add a refreshment stand, Bake Sale, Silent Auction, and musical entertainment and there is a feeling of a cross between a carnival and a family reunion. Old acquaintances are renewed and new friends are made. An informal program of introductions showed the wide range of support for this fund raiser: the 35 volunteers of the picnic staff, Masters and Past Masters, Grand Lodge of California Officers, Scottish Rite of California Officers, and leaders of the many appendant groups, all there to support the Santa Barbara Scottish Rite Childhood Language Center. The Santa Barbara Center serves children with speech and language disorders at no cost to the families in Ventura, Santa Barbara, and San Luis Obispo counties.
