From the PR's Quill *Ill John F. Lowe, 33°* **Civility—A Journey or a Destination?**

Many new initiates to Masonry, upon receiving their first degree, ask what can be said about their experience when asked by family or friends. To this question, the answer is often that the new member has undergone а transformative experience; that he has taken an oath to be a better man, a better husband, brother, son. and citizen. Indeed. if we follow this transformation through all three degrees, then every master mason is destined to travel, as we say, from being a good man journey towards the in becoming a better man. Our visualization technique for this is, of course, the transition from rough ashlar to finished ashlar.

However, as a teaching fraternity, are we yet missing an important facet in that which makes a truly *better* man? A logical argument may be made that when much of our esoteric work was first formulated that masons, as well as the larger society, were civil in action and tongue. A *gentleman* was



known to engage in discourse without resorting to verbal abuse or temper. The very term civil discourse points to the dictates of social intercourse requiring thought and respect when discussing matters of importance. То this. our fraternal teaching adds courtesy and affability as masonic traits. To all, regardless of station in life, we must act with courtesy and civility in speech and deed.

Our current national environment, being driven by the major political parties of the United States, bombards us daily with rhetoric very much

antithetical civility. to highest Candidates for the office in the land use social media as a cudgel striking out at their real or perceived political opposites. Far too many of our population then model this same behavior: find ourselves and we in seemingly an increasingly *uncivil* society. Even though we may feel like an exemplar of civil behavior. we may be quite hesitant to even attempt to hold civil discourse with family and friends. Better to dodge than engage in a foolhardy Can Masonry help attempt? society regain civility lost?

This was the wellspring forming the Masonic Civility Committee several years ago. We have an educational Masons system spread across the continent, already in place with tools and symbolism to show, teach, and pass on the regaining of civility in our daily lives. The plumb. level. square, and compasses can thus be repurposed implements of persuasion, as changing from merely the builder's use over to new, far more important work.

In operative masonry, we use the plumb to check for vertical trueness and to be upright in our conduct. In operative maritime use, the plumb is used to check the depth of waters beneath a vessel. In our repurposing, let us think of the plumb to gauge a lack of The longer the plumb civility. line, the deeper runs rudeness, mistreatment, and lack of respect. As the lessons of civility are inculcated, we can metaphorically see the plumb line becoming shorter; eventually so short that only the plumb remains with a hands-breadth of line-an indicator that perhaps only a puddle of remains, abuse shortly to evaporate into courtesy.

Let us repurpose the square from a building tool to a *reflecting* tool. Just as a vertical wall will reflect back sound waves, if we hold a square with one side vertical it becomes the symbolic reflector of words and speech back to us. When reflected back, are the words indeed showing careful thought, mindful of content, and thus received by the other party as valuable? Are we stating a fact, or attempting to force an opinion upon someone else? Can your words influence without taking something away from the other person? With this tool in mind, one may reflect on thoughts before engaging the mouth. The goal is learning the other person's opinions while reflecting back understanding and genuine interest.

The level, used by builders to horizontals, prove we mav repurpose and indicate that it is limitless in size thus including the entire population upon its flat As we are taught in plane. Masonry, we must stive to encourage all we may encounter to consider all humans as part of one family. With all caste distinction thus removed, a civil society is individuals. respectful of all regardless of station or prominence. Does not a beggar deserve respectful consideration of their plight and perhaps a kind word? Surely a barista or meal server has feelings and looks forward to pleasant interchanges with customers... or do they? Our metaphorical level reaches under the drive-in window: kindness and affability are deserved, just as we would with a person of high social standing.

Finally, we may also repurpose the compasses for a more important use. Rather than drawing a mere circle or even thinking about circling our finite, personal world, let us expand the legs of our compass to encircle the entire world and all therein contained. In this manner anyone with whom you may come in contact is therefore within the circumference of importance to you. In other words, within this circle is a world existing in harmony, with only civil discourse being observed across the landscape. Is this not a worthy goal for all Masons, bringing the bright light of kindness, compassion, affability, and friendship back out from under the blanket of rudeness? Can we return civility to its rightful place so humankind reflects the original design given to us by the Supreme Architect? As Freemasons working under the all-seeing eye of history, it is our duty and our destiny to model, to teach civil behavior to all on our journey towards a perfect ashlar.
