From the PR's Quill Ill John F. Lowe, 33°

To the Family of Ventura Scottish Rite:

As presented at the October Stated Meeting, our Valley has an opportunity before it that is both new and exciting. The California Scottish Rite Foundation amended the requirements for opening and sustaining Rite Care health offerings in California valleys.

Thus, with Foundation assistance, our Valley may begin the pathway to providing Rite Care, right here. Several months of work lie ahead, but Masons never shy from hard work.



Additional information will be forthcoming at the annual meeting of Secretaries and Representatives with our Sovereign Grand Inspector General in November. But to set the stage, so to speak, is information presented at the last Stated Meeting...

• Funds from our annual Lobster Feed we provide to the Santa Barbara Center as you know. Under the new concept, the amount can underpin a new Ventura Center. The approximately \$6,500 net each year will then stay local.

- In reality, the Santa Barbara Center utilizes grants and donations to support their mission. These sources will no doubt backfill the loss of our contribution.
- With a budget this small we will need to start as a teletherapy location only.
 - During the Pandemic, all our California Care Centers began using teletherapy (think, Zoom) to maintain services while the state was shut down. This method continues to be a cost-effective way to provide service.
- This budget allows us to provide 1 to 2 hours per week of services.
 - It may not sound like much, but as a beginning it is imperative. Actively providing services will assist us in writing grant proposals for funding to expand.
 - In using the tele-services model, we have opportunity to use therapists from other centers, rather than immediately hiring for our center.
- Establishing services then allows us to begin writing grant requests for more funds so that we can grow the center over time.
 - Grants and donations not only fund operations of the language centers, but they also build linkages between the center and community organizations.
- The Foundation will create the website and all marketing collateral for the language center.
 - This assistance provides a standard look for a new website as well as proven marketing material that we do not need to develop on our own.
- The Foundation will begin a paid marketing campaign on LinkedIn, Facebook, and Google; and will include a commercial shared message through YouTube. This will benefit all language centers.
 - As with the webpages, centralized marketing campaigns are very effective, and we benefit from professional messaging.
- Our Valley needs to create a local Language Center Board. At the annual meeting in November, the Foundation will release guidance including board member roles and responsibilities. Recommended is beginning with 5 -- nor less than 5 members.
 - Best practices show that this board should be comprised of both Scottish Rite members as well as community (non-Mason) members. If you know of persons who can provide expertise, funding sources,

and a commitment to services provided by Rite Care, please provide the information to any officer.

• Of course, any member of our Valley wishing to serve in this important capacity is encouraged to add their name for consideration.

The following are Strategic Planning items that have served our Fraternity well in planning. I offer them here as we begin the process to open a Rite Care in the Ventura Valley.

- 1. **Mission statement**: A statement that concisely summarizes what the organization does, presenting the main purposes for all its major functions and operations.
- 2. **Long-term goals**: A specific set of policy, programmatic, and management goals for the programs and operations covered in the strategic plan. The long-term goals should correspond to the purposes set forth in the mission statement and develop with greater specificity how an organization will carry out its mission.
- 3. **Strategies to achieve the goals**: A description of how the goals contained in the strategic plan and performance plan are to be achieved, including the operational processes; skills and technology; and the human, capital, information, and other resources required to meet these goals.
- 4. **External factors that could affect goals**: Key factors external to the organization and beyond its control that could significantly affect the achievement of the long-term goals contained in the strategic plan. These external factors can include economic, demographic, social, technological, or environmental factors, as well as conditions or events that would affect the organization's ability to achieve its strategic goals.
- 5. **Stakeholder involvement**: Consideration of the views and suggestions-solicited during the development of the strategic plan-- of those entities potentially affected by or interested in the organization's activities.
- 6. **Use of metrics to gauge progress**: A set of metrics that will be applied to gauge progress toward attainment of each of the plan's long-term goals.
- 7. **Evaluations of the plan to monitor goals and objectives**: Assessments, through objective measurement and systematic analysis, of the manner and extent to which programs associated with the strategic plan achieve their intended goals

I hope that you will share in the excitement and planning as we work to establish a Ventura center!
