Scottish Rite Workshop on Proper Philanthropic Planning

The Supreme Council's Development Office will hold a philanthropic workshop for members of the Orient of California. The workshop will be hosted by the Valley of Pasadena, 150 N. Madison Avenue, Pasadena, on Saturday, October 13, 2018, from 10:00 AM to 3:00 PM. The workshop will be presented by Brother Don Heath, 33°, the Major Donor Officer for the Western United States of the Southern Jurisdiction, AASR, who will explore "Proper Philanthropic Planning" with particular emphasis on the House of the Temple Historic Preservation Foundation, Inc., the Scottish Rite Foundation, SJ, USA, Inc., and the California Scottish Rite Foundation. The program is designed to give the Brethren information on how planned giving can be of benefit to them financially, as well as, enhancing their desire to fulfill their obligation for "Brotherly Relief" to those in need.

The various charitable gift plans available will be discussed in detail with explanation of the tax and income benefits of each. Case examples will be explored with hypotheticals designed to relate to the donor's circumstances and financial considerations. The details of Charitable Gift Annuities, Charitable Remainder Trusts, and several other planned giving vehicles will be presented. The presentation will include information on giving to the California Scottish Rite Foundation. The Donor Recognition Program will be reviewed, as well as, the requirements for joining the Intendant of the Building Society and the Acacia Guild. There will be time for questions concerning how these gift plans might be tailored to the best advantage of the donor and the chosen beneficiary. A light lunch will be served.
